### How to Subscribe to an iCloud Calendar on an Android Device

If someone has shared an iCloud calendar with you, follow these steps to add it to Google Calendar on your Android phone.

#### Step 1: Get the iCloud Calendar Link

#### Step 2: Add the Calendar to Google Calendar

1. Open Google Calendar in a web browser (**preferably on a computer**):
2. On the left sidebar, find “Other calendars” and click the “+” icon.
3. Select “From URL” from the dropdown menu.
4. Paste the calendar link (https://...) into the URL box.
5. Click “Add calendar”.

#### Step 3: Sync with Your Android Device

1. Open the Google Calendar app on your Android phone.
2. Tap the ☰ Menu (top-left corner).
3. Scroll down and check if the new calendar is listed under “Other calendars”.
4. If you don't see it immediately:

- Tap Settings  > Select the added calendar > Enable Sync.
- Close and reopen the app to refresh.

**Done!** Your iCloud calendar should now be visible in your Google Calendar and will update automatically. You have the option to hide this calendar if you do not want it visible at all times by unchecking the box next to the calendar name located under “Other calendars”.
